What a great year we have had at school, and we can't believe that it is coming to end already. We just wanted to update you on how much each of the events that the PTA have put on over the past school year have raised with your support.

Halloween Disco: £250.98

Winter Ball: £2,000

Breakfast with Santa: it cost £330.44 to put on and we received £289.55 in donations, so PTA paid £40.89 Thank you for the donations.

Sports days: £85.10

Ice creams selling: £273.57

Climbing wall: £724

Summer fair: I'm still working this out but it looks to be around £700 profit.

The monies raised from the Christmas movie night and the cheese and wine night will be announced in September, as I need to speak to our accountant who has the receipts for these events.

We have spent:

£320 for Year 3 coach in December

All monies raised are going back into school, and we will be giving school a cheque for £3,000 today which will pay for the new markings on the infant playground, which will be done over the summer and start of new term.
